Dearhearts,

It is in the presence of God that His people find their strength and their peace in this journey here. The trouble with prosperity is that it camouflages the realities of this harsh place with a rosy haze that minimizes the need for vibrant faith. Generic faith finds its place quite comfortably in Laodicea; such faith does not sustain in the winters of our soul or in the calamities of loss. In its wealth, Laodicea was needless and worshipped a Job's friends god who proved righteousness with wealth. Yet Christ's words tell of another world - one of tribulation in which faith does not suspend the harsh realities but equips us to overcome them in Him. Christian history – the history of the faithful – tells this story.

In the second century, as Polycarp burned at the stake, he was engulfed in the presence of the Lord and died with a smile on his face. The Marquis of Argyle of Scotland, wrapped in the presence of God, went to his death "in the most perfect peace."

Jeanne Guyon came from wealth, had an oppressive marriage, was eventually separated from her children and was imprisoned in the Bastille for 9 years because of her teachings on prayer. Yet it was in her tribulation that she came to know God in profound ways. Her writings continue to part the folds of God's mysteries as few have done. Susannah Wesley buried 11 of 19 children and was left alone for many months to provide for her children while her minister-husband was in debtor's prison. Their house burned 3 times and her husband abandoned her and the children for several months over a political disagreement. In it all, Susannah spent 2 hours daily seeking the Lord. There she found comfort and strength to endure the flames that scorched her world. It was here, too, that her children saw the unrelenting faithfulness of their mother and of the God she loved. Two of her children, John and Charles, established a church based upon the spiritual Methods they witnessed in their mother. It was this Method-ist church that spearheaded the great spiritual awakening that was to sustain Europe for almost two centuries.

In the midst of struggle we come to know Him. In your most arduous paths, seek Him. He hears the cry of an anguished heart. He hears the voice of longing...the voice that knows its need for God. Though He seemed out of reach when Peter cried for help as He sank in the waves, Christ instantly was there to lift him up. In the midst of impossible fires, stand in faith, and like Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, you will see a familiar figure with you in the flames preserving you and leading you out.

So how do we run to Him? Our heart first must yield to His ways. Only as we see our need for Him will we do this; till then, we will resist because we somehow think we know best. There is celebration to be found in hard or uncertain times; the celebration of discovering our own littleness and His greatness...the celebration of discovering humility. Only in humble submission to Him will we ever know peace...

2009 could be a very bad year...or it could be a year of discovery.

SAFE – a Resource for Those Dealing With Childhood Sexual Abuse or Abandonment

A new section of pages is coming on line the first of this month designed to help people better understand the consequences of sexual abuse or abandonment in childhood and to better navigate its effects in their life.

SafeNotes provides information on abuse and abandonment: what it is, what it does to a person's core and how it affects behaviors and attitudes.

SafeScript looks at God's principles for healing and how they can be implemented in a person's life.

SafeStories will carry accounts of some who have experienced healing.

SafeTalk will carry Brenda's responses to questions that have come in to the safetalk email link <u>safetalk@dayspringdiscipleship.org</u>. This email address is also available for those needing a safe place to ask questions but who desire only a personal response without being placed on line.

Because of the complexity of these issues, information will be added weekly to SafeNotes and SafeScript, and as emails come in they will be posted on the **SafeTalk Q & A.**

SAFE stands for Sexual Abuse Freedom Encounter, a seminar conducted by Brenda for survivors of childhood sexual abuse and abandonment. Without a safe place to sort through what has happened in a person's life, one cannot experience the freedom available through the healing principles of Christ. Our hope is that these pages will offer such safety for the healing journey to begin...or to continue.
