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Dearhearts,

What remains, after all the dross has been scooped away, is pure gold. That which is sought after by all the world; that which created great waves of seekers to the Alaskan slopes. What remains after the chaff has been blown away, is the wheat that produces life and sustains it and from which new things are made. It is pure opium, pure cocaine, that pharmaceuticals and drug cartels go for. That which is pure is most malleable, most powerful. All the world seeks for what is pure.

What is left after 10,000 have been culled down to 300 is an army fit to do battle for the Lord. What was left, after the rich young man turned away from Christ with his possessions still in tact, was another rich man who gave his money back, four-fold, to those whom he had wrongfully taxed. The first man was of a broader fabric, culled away. The latter was of remnant cloth.

What is left over, after all the undecided and uncommitted have drifted away, is the remnant. That thin thread of people through whom God is able to move most powerfully; through whom He changes the world. The world hung once on a single strand of thread...a family of eight lone survivors of the evil that overtook the world. After the bewildered turned away in droves from One whose words they did not understand, what was left was the remnant thread of disciples and a supporting cast of women who remained twined with Christ whether they understood Him or not. Once again, the world hung on the thinnest of threads...a "family" of eleven this time charged with bringing the willing of earth into God's ark.

His ark must look different than the world...stocked with other than what the world offers...else why would people leave their world for His? The world needs from us what it cannot get anywhere else. It needs what it does not know it needs. It needs us to be what no one else can be. The world has its crusaders, its passionate, its fierce and angry...its hopeless. Only we can soften the world with grace, deflect its blows with forgiveness, assuage its fierceness with love and infuse it with the hope that ever lies within us.

No matter what happens, we are not without hope. No matter how unraveled this world is, we are not a desperate people. We do not fear as others do. We know the end of the story. We know the author of the story. The frantic posturing we see in this country today is not of us...nor of God. This is why the world needs us. Needs us to be of remnant cloth. Needs us to be different than it...to offer what it cannot brew.

Our lives should call forth the difference. Our lives should speak to the longings of this world; our love should pour out a water that touches the deepest hollows in the human soul. The fears and anxieties and obsessions...the excesses of our time...are but echoes from caverns in the soul as yet unfilled by a Water only we carry...a Water poured out at Calvary.

If we employ the same harshness the world carries, why would it be drawn to this Fountain? If we use the same rhetoric and shrillness, how will they know of the hope placed within us at Calvary? Why would they want it? When once you and I gathered around the cross and said, "Thank you!" – when once we shed tears of contrition at Golgotha - eternity seared our soul in hope. Not as the world gives it…but hope of another sort. Nothing else matters as once it did. Eternity tethers all things. Death has lost its sting. I know I will see my family again that has gone before me.

And the urgent carries a different tone. I know that if this country unravels, it is by a Hand that moves heaven and earth and ordains kings and nations. We are not random...nor is the reign of nations. *This* hope is that which we are to speak into the world. *This* hope is that which ever lies within us that no one else can know. But the world can only know of such hope and of its Giver if it can see in you and me something it does not have...that illusive something man's soul has instinctively longed for...a pure vein in the ore.

The world yearns for what is true and real; it seeks a power greater than itself. All the world seeks for that which is pure...it just doesn't know what it really is until it sees it.

First Level of Person of Impact Concludes

The second tier of *Becoming a Person of Impact* will pick up toward the end of January of next year with a look at the major core issues that affect how we approach life and relationships. We will also look at what the core of a person consists of and what happens when it is damaged. In this level, also, we will look at how a wounded core finds healing.

We remain gratified by the interest and attendance for the first part of this course designed to better equip Christians to minister to family and friends. From responses of many who attended, it provided heightened understanding not only for others but for their own areas of struggle or woundedness.

Among the topics to be covered in the second level are: Identity, belonging, abandonment, shame, boundaries, power and control.

At this point, the *third level* will not begin until April at the earliest. It will be comprised of two Bible studies, one on *Breaking Generational Sin Patterns* and the other on *Bringing Down Strongholds*.

chapel to small churches on Sunday mornings as a help to them and to us financially. The down-side has been the damage done to the chairs; at least ten have been torn or stained. Replacing only the damaged ones isn't possible because this chair is no longer available, so the options are to leave them as is or to replace all fifty of them. We have found a chair on line for \$24.00 per chair, including shipping. This is an excellent price, but is still beyond our reach for fifty chairs.
